


This guide is about Inclusion Ireland and advocacy

Inclusion Ireland



Inclusion Ireland is the national organisation for people with an intellectual disability



We keep issues about people with intellectual disabilities in the news



We try and get the Government, service providers and others to listen to people with a disability



We provide information to people with an intellectual disability

Advocacy



Advocacy <u>is</u> about saying what you want

Advocacy is <u>not</u> about getting what you want



Self advocacy is when you speak up for yourself



You can also speak up as part of a group



Its ok to get support to speak up

The Advocate



An advocate is someone that is trained to support you to have your voice heard



An advocate listens to what you have to say



An advocate explains things to you in a way that you can understand




An advocate gives you time to think about things before you make a decision

The Advocate



An advocate is always independent of care staff or service providers



An advocate is for <u>you</u> and will remain loyal to <u>you</u>



An advocate will always keep things about you private




An advocate will always treat you with respect

Examples of advocacy issues




An advocate can help you to talk about your views and wishes about where you live



An advocate can help you to talk if you are getting bullied or treated badly



An advocate can help if you have questions or concerns about money



An advocate can help you to understand your rights


Things an advocate won't do



Your advocate will <u>never</u> make decisions for you



Your advocate will <u>never</u> treat you in a way that would make you worried or afraid



Your advocate will <u>never</u> accept money from you



Your advocate won't refuse to speak with you – but might not always be available.





If you have a complaint




If you are unhappy with our advocacy service you can make a complaint




You can tell the advocate or the people in charge at Inclusion Ireland
